Litchfield Sweet Corn Days



August, the last month of summer is already here, and it promises to be an exciting month. Over the next 30 days, in addition to producing energy for our members, we will be finalizing preparation plans for our major turbine outage and all of the associated repairs and maintenance items that need to be accomplished while Endicott is off-line. It has been 7 years since our last turbine major, and although it is expected that this outage will last between 5 and 6 weeks, the effort by all will be well worth it.

You may have noticed the gas pipeline sections that are being stored temporarily on our property. These 6 inch pipes will be installed by SEMCO over the next month to provide the gas service necessary to service the new gas lighters, the first two of which are already in operation. Switching our lighters from fuel oil to natural gas will help reduce our startup and deck switching costs, as well as providing a 23% reduction in CO2 emissions from these sources.

Last week the Agency completed the paperwork involved with acquiring the assets of Symbiotic of Litchfield, LLC. Over the next 2 ½ months, there is a lot of work to be done to bring the FTF project into full commercial operation. The replacement of the fork assemblies is about half done, a new fan is to be delivered in September, work is progressing on the wire bailer and magnet system, quotes for the replacement of the tire feeding system are in process, a third gas takeoff line is being engineered, and site work is underway for the tire tipper and sorting equipment.

With all that needs to be done, I want to remind everyone to be especially diligent with respect to safety. Many times, when we are working in different environments, there is a tendency to be a little complacent. Stay alert, and let's make this the best and safest outage ever.

Hydrate When The Heat Is On

It is important to drink water, especially when you are working or exercising when the weather is hot. Physical exertion in high temperatures can bring on heat stroke, heat exhaustion, and other illnesses if you are not careful.

The body cools itself by perspiring, and needs to replace the water it loses. Drink water more frequently when you are exerting yourself, so you do not become dehydrated. Avoid alcohol and drinks with large amounts of caffeine, as they cause the body to release water.

The water should be cool if possible (50 to 60 degrees is ideal), but very cold drinks could cause stomach cramps. You should not wait until you are thirsty to have a drink. To maintain good hydration, drink two to four glasses of nonalcoholic beverages each hour when the weather is hot.

In addition to drinking water, it is important to take rest breaks in a cool, shaded area to prevent heat-related illnesses. Wear a wide-brimmed hat and cool clothing. It is vital to take these precautions when temperature and humidity levels are high and there is no breeze.

By the numbers:
